FCC Commissioner Mignon Clyburn says that existing TVs and cable equipment "will not be able to receive a next-gen signal."

"If you are an over-the-air viewer, you will either need to purchase a new television set or some sort of converter, and if you are a pay TV viewer you would need to purchase a new set-top box," she said.

1. It is true that existing set-top boxes will not receive Next-Gen TV signals. They do not receive today's ATSC 1.0 signals either. They receive a cable TV signal that has been compressed and transmitted by the cable company usually over coax. Existing cable boxes will continue to work because the cable company will continue sending Next-Gen channels to customers the same way they do now - down converted to HD, compressed, and via coax. The only reasons for immediate replacement of cable boxes, would be to offer higher quality content and additional features beyond the capability of firmware updates. Set-top boxes do not last forever, so they eventually need to be replaced anyway. The same goes for satellite receivers.

Future set-top boxes or satellite receivers could include ATSC 3.0 reception. However, pay TV providers want consumers to rely solely on their service, so they are unlikely to allow it, even though that horse is already out of the barn with other streaming devices.

- 2. Most cable companies provide cable boxes, so "you" would not be purchasing a new set-top box, although cable box or satellite receiver rental is part of your expense.
- 3. If you are part of the 10% of over the air audience (the cable TV industry claims 10% in FCC comments), then you will eventually need to purchase a new TV or converter. However, broadcasters have a mandate and economic incentives to try to provide their main channel via ATSC 1.0 for at least 5 years after they begin ATSC 3.0 broadcasts. The reason that subchannels will likely not be included is because the FCC has recently sold off 16 TV channels to wireless providers in a "reverse auction" and subsequent "spectrum repack," leaving little spectrum available for dual broadcasts. during the Obama





Great decision! The requirement to simulcast comes as a surprise, though, but not a bad surprise. As much as I like 8VSB, this kind of a break with the past is necessary to allow the use of a fundamentally different data transmission standard, one which reflects real world experience from the use of both 8VSB and ODFM modulations. I honestly have to say Rosenworcel and Clyburn have their heads in the sand on this one. I bet they still use buggy whips, and rotary dial telephones. Unlike the previous 'break with tradition' that ATSC 1.0 brought us, the flexibility of virtually all modern TVs easily allows the use of an external converter device with no penalty in performance, and in many cases, something as simple as an ethernet connection.
