FCC SETS FOR NEW BY-THE-BOOK EAS TEST.

AUG. 22, 2016

As broadcasters gear up for next month's national Emergency Alert System test, the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau has released a new EAS Operating Handbook. Under Federal Communication Commission regulations, a copy of the handbook must be located at normal duty positions or near EAS equipment when a test is being administered. For stations, that means the newest version of the handbook must be in place in time for the Sept. 28 national EAS test.

The handbook's new format was designed by broadcasters, equipment manufacturers and regulators in a format that will allow each station to enter specific data to create their own tailored version of the document showing the operational steps necessary for that station.

The FCC continues to prepare stations for the second-ever national EAS test, which will take place at 2:20pm ET on Wed., Sept. 28. Before then, radio and TV stations are required to register with the EAS Test Reporting System (ETRS) by August 26. That will come into play after the next month's national test when broadcasters will use the

web-based system to file a brief initial "day of test" report within 24 hours of the national activation to be followed by a more detailed post-test documentation by Nov. 14.

The national test will assess the "reliability and effectiveness" of the EAS according to the FCC which says a particular emphasis will be paid to testing FEMA's Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS). That's the gateway through which common alerting protocol-based (CAP-based) alerts are disseminated to EAS participants including local radio and TV stations. "One of the main purposes of the test is to measure delays and latencies in the delivery of alerts," the FCC says in a statement.

Following the previous national test in 2011, the FCC says next month's activation will be "diagnostic in nature" to show how well improvements made in the past five years work—and what else needs to be addressed.





SBE Files Comments on RF Noise, Urges Noise Study

On August 11, the SBE filed comments with the FCC regarding a public notice in ET Docket 16-191. The FCC informed readers that its Technological Advisory Council (TAC), an advisory group to the FCC operating under the Federal Advisory Committee Act, is investigating changes and trends to the radio spectrum noise floor to determine if there is an increasing noise problem, and if so, the scope and quantitative evidence of such problem(s), and how a noise study should be performed. In its comments, the SBE provided responses to the TAC for its investigation. Further, the SBE provided insight into the scope and quantitative evidence of the problem and stated that a noise study should be performed by the TAC.

SBE President Jerry Massey, CPBE, 8-VSB, AMD, DRB, CBNT, adds, "The SBE has taken a leading role in addressing the RF noise issue. The SBE-recommended study is extremely important in identifying the obstacles to AM revitalization and interference to FM and OTA television broadcasting. A successful noise study will provide insight as well into the FCC's spectrum planning, and it will provide some desperately needed objectivity in rules governing Part 15 and Part 18 devices and the process of spectrum overlays in the broadcast auxiliary service bands."
